HOW TO SEARCH THE INVENTORY

The search function is key-word based, and collects results from the series, study and variable levels of each data collection. The following highlights important search functions of the Ed Data Inventory, guiding first-time users in navigating the application.

PERFORMING A BASIC SEARCH

A basic search will perform a default boolean "And" search for multiple search terms. For example, searching on "*child care*" will yield results that contain both "*child*" and "*care*". The last five search terms from your current session will be saved.

How to perform a basic search:

- Type your search terms into the search box located in the upper-right hand corner of the navigation bar.
- Click the magnifying glass button to perform a search.
